**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PROVISIONS OF THE CHATHAM CODE
OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO CLOSING HOURS FOR LIQUOR
LICENSEES**

*BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE
VILLAGE OF CHATHAM, SANGAMON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:*

SECTION 1: 111.22(A) of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Chatham is amended to state as follows:

(1) Except as provided in subsection (A)(1) and (A)(2) of this section, it shall be unlawful for the holder of any license issued under this chapter to sell or offer for sale at retail any alcoholic liquor in the Village during the following hours:

- a. Monday through Saturday: 12:00 midnight to 8:00 a.m.
- b. Sunday: 12:00 midnight to 12:00 noon and after 10:00 p.m.

(2). It shall be unlawful for the holder of an R-1 or R-2 license located in an area zoned B-1 under the Chatham Zoning Ordinance, to sell or offer for sale at retail any alcoholic liquor in the Village during the following hours:

- a. Monday through Thursday: 12:00 midnight to 8:00 a.m. and after 10:00 p.m.
- b. Friday and Saturday: 12:00 midnight to 8:00 a.m.
- c. Sunday: 12:00 midnight to 12:00 noon and after 10:00 p.m.

(3) It shall be unlawful for the holder of a Class "T" license issued under this chapter to sell or offer for sale at retail any alcoholic liquor in the Village during the following hours:

a. Monday through Friday: 12:00 midnight to 8:00 a.m.

b. Saturday: 1:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.

b. Sunday: 1:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and after 10:00 p.m.


SECTION 2: This Ordinance is effective on its passage and publication. The Clerk shall forthwith publish it in pamphlet form and shall mail a copy to every holder of a liquor license issued by the Village.
