ORDINANCE NO. 23-35

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE VILLAGE CODE
TO ADD A TEMPORARY EVENT LIQUOR LICENSE**

WHEREAS, the Village of Chatham (hereinafter “Village”) is an Illinois Municipal Corporation existing and operating under the Illinois Municipal Code and the laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Liquor Control Act of 1934, 235 ILCS 5/4-1, sets forth the rights of municipalities to govern and restrict the sale of alcoholic liquor within their communities; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-2 of the Act provides that the Village has the authority to determine the number, kind and classification of licenses for sale at retail of alcoholic liquor, not inconsistent with the Act, and the amount of local licensee fees to be paid for the various kinds of licenses to be issued; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-2 of the Act provides that the Village has the authority to establish such further regulations and restrictions upon the issuance of a local license not inconsistent with the law as the public good and convenience may require; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village believe it is in the best interest of the Village to amend the Village Liquor Code as set forth herein to add a temporary event license.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Chatham, Sangamon County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated into and made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth in this Section 1.

Section 2. Amendment to Village Code. Chapter 111 of the Village Code shall be amended as shown in detail on Exhibit A. The amendment is shown as follows: added; ~~deleted~~.

Section 3. Severability. In the event that any section, clause, provision, or part of this Ordinance shall be found and determined to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid parts shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. Repeal and Savings Clause. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall affect any rights, action, or causes of action which shall have accrued to the Village of Chatham prior to the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 5. Effectiveness. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

EXHIBIT A
AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 111

CHAPTER 111: ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

111.10 DEFINITIONS.

TEMPORARY EVENT. An event conducted by or at the location of a for-profit business or private individual.

TEMPORARY EVENT RETAILER. A for-profit business which sells or offers for sale, alcoholic spirits, beer, and / or wine only for consumption at the location and on the dates designated by a temporary event license.

111.11 APPLICATION FOR LICENSE.

(M) In addition to any other requirement of this section, an applicant for a special event retailer's or a temporary event retailer's license shall also submit proof of adequate dram shop insurance for the special event or the temporary event prior to being issued a license.

111.17 CLASSIFICATION AND FEES

(A) *Non Gaming Licenses.*

(17) A Class TE "Temporary Event" license shall authorize the sale at retail during a temporary event on the premises specified, and during the time specified therein, of alcoholic liquor by a temporary event retailer. The term of the license shall not exceed five days. The license application shall set forth whether or not the event is open to the public and shall contain an estimate of the largest number of adult persons expected to be in attendance at any time during the event. The estimate shall be based on historical attendance experiences for similar events after consultation by the license applicant with the Chief of Police. The fee for the license shall be as follows:

(a) If the temporary event is not open to the public, or if it is open to the public and less than 250 adult persons are expected be in attendance at the event at any time: \$50 per day or portion of a day;

(b) If the temporary event is open to the public and 250 adult persons or more are expected to be in attendance at any time: \$100 per day or portion of a day.

(C) The number of licenses issued by the village shall be as follows:

(18) There may be seven Class TG licenses; and

(19) There may be one Class ETG license; and

(20) There may be one Class TE license outstanding at any time.
