

RESOLUTION 13-89

A RESOLUTION CREATING A CHATHAM DAY

WHEREAS, the Commission to celebrate the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution has designated certain important dates in 1989 as milestones to celebrate in the creation of our modern government, namely the creation of the Federal Judiciary, and the submission of the Bill of Rights to the state for ratification; and

WHEREAS, the Bicentennial of the creation of our modern form of government under the Constitution is and ought to be celebrated with the appropriate ceremonies in Chatham; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Chatham has sponsored such celebrations before, variously called Chatham Days; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Chatham maintains a keen interest in celebrating the creation of our form of government and the local connection thereto; and

WHEREAS, a committee for celebrating the Bicentennial of the important events of 1789, and Chatham Days is being formed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHATHAM, SANGAMON COUNTY, AND THE STATE OF ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

that a committee to plan proper and appealing activities and programs by which all of our citizens can participate in celebrating and commemorating important dates and events relating thereto be appointed.
