

RESOLUTION 18-90

RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING FRIDAY, MAY 18, 1990, AS S.A.D.D. DAY

WHEREAS, one of the basic goals of the Village of Chatham is to provide a safe transportation system; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Chatham supports and endorses the goals and objectives of **STUDENTS AGAINST DRUNK DRIVING**; and

WHEREAS, the Chatham Police Department has endeavoured to educate our youth in the past and will continue in the future of the effects of driving while under the influence of drugs or alcohol; and

WHEREAS, five students from our area have perished in alcohol related automobile accidents; and

WHEREAS, students and faculty members of Glenwood High School are actively pursuing the process of education on the reality of drinking and driving; and

WHEREAS, in the United States 25,000 Americans are killed, 70,000 are injured and every 23 seconds an innocent person is affected by a drunk driver; and

WHEREAS, MAY 19, 1990 is the date of the Prom at Glenwood High School, where drinking of alcohol is prevalent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHATHAM, SANGAMON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, that MAY 18, 1990 be proclaimed as S.A.D.D. DAY, and that this shall be set aside for activities promoting the philosophy of **FRIENDS DO NOT LET FRIENDS DRIVE DRUNK.**
